

Evaluation System and Promotion Policy 2020-21
CLASS I TO V

(Promotion Policy may vary as per CBSE Policy)

1. **Classes- I to V** will be based on CCE system comprises of FA-I , FA-II, FA-III, FA-IV, SA-I and SA-II. FA-I ,FA-IV, SA-I and SA-II will be Written based. and FA-II , FA-III will be activity based.
FA-I(10%) + FA-II(10%) + SA-I(30%) + FA-III(10%)+ FA-IV(10%)+ SA-II(30%)
2. There will be regular classes during Formative Assessment.
3. **SA-I and SA-II** will be of 50 marks for classes I to V.
4. **For GK**, all the Written Exam will be objective based.
5. **Computer Science**, FA-I will be written based. FA-II, FA-III and FA-IV will be practical based. In SA-I and SA-II , 30 marks will be written and 20 marks will be practical based examination.
6. **Co-Scholastic Activities**-Co-Scholastic activities (Work Education, Art Education and Health and Physical education) will be conducted for holistic development of the student. These activities will be graded on a 3-point grading system (A to C) and will have no descriptive indicators.
7. **Discipline** - Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps to build character. It will be graded on a 3-point grading system (A to C) and will have no descriptive indicators.
8. A Student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance during the academic year and clear all the dues before he/she is eligible to appear in the Exam.
9. Use of unfair means in the test/examination may lead to the strict disciplinary action.
10. In case a child is likely to be absent from any test or examination the parent should seek permission in writing prior to the test/examination. If a student remains absent for any test/examination without adequate reason they will be awarded zero in the test/examination. In case of illness a doctor's certificate will be required.

CLASS VI TO VIII

(Promotion Policy may vary as per CBSE Policy)

1. **Classes- VI to VIII**, Assessment Structure comprises of 2 Terms. **In Term -1**, there will be periodic Assessment and Half yearly Exam and in **Term -2** , there will be periodic Assessment and Yearly Exam. **Each Term** will include Periodic Assessment ,Notebook Maintenance and Subject Enrichment activities.
3. There will be regular classes during Periodic Assessment.
4. **Half Yearly and Yearly Exam** will be of 80 marks.
5. **For Classes VI to VIII -Yearly Exam** will be conducted at the end of the year covering the portion as follows:

Class	Portion
VI	10% of 1 st Term covering significant topics +entire syllabus of 2 nd Term

VII
VIII

20% of 1st Term covering significant topics +entire syllabus of 2nd Term
30% of 1st Term covering significant topics +entire syllabus of 2nd Term

Student need to secure 33% to pass in aggregate(Term-1 + Term-2).

6. **For GK**, all the Written Exam will be objective based.

7. **Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence** , class VI to VIII- In Term-1, Periodic Assessment will be Computer based Objective test and in Term-2, Periodic Assessment will be practical based.

In Half Yearly and Yearly Exam for classes VI to VIII – 60 marks will be Computer based Objective test and 20 marks will be practical based examination.

8. **Co-Scholastic Activities**-Co-Scholastic activities(Work Education, Art Education and Health and Physical education) will be conducted for holistic development of the student. These activities will be graded on a 3-point grading system(A to C) and will have no descriptive indicators.

9. **Discipline** - Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps to build character. It will be graded on a 3-point grading system(A to C) and will have no descriptive indicators.

10. A Student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance during the academic year and clear all the dues before he/she is eligible to appear in the Yearly Exam.

11. Use of unfair means in the test/examination may lead to the strict disciplinary action.

12. In case a child is likely to be absent from any test or examination the parent should seek permission in writing prior to the test/examination. If a student remains absent for any test/examination without adequate reason they will be awarded zero in the test/examination. In case of illness a doctor's certificate will be required.

CLASS XI & XII

(Promotion Policy may vary as per CBSE Policy)

- For class XI, Each academic year has been divided into two terms:
UNIT 1(10%) + UNIT 2(10%) +Half yearly(30%) + Annual Exam(50%) = 100%
- Unit test will be of 40 marks. During unit test, there will be regular classes.
- In annual examination, students of class XI , has to secure passing marks in aggregate(separately in theory and practical).
- Maximum marks for Half yearly, Preboard and Annual Exam will be according to CBSE pattern
- Unit test will be of 40 marks and 1 hr 30 min duration
