- Multiple Assessments will also be conducted for each subject in the form of spell check, listening, speaking, and writing activities, concept mapping, map work, diagrams etc. as per the subject's requirement. Subject teachers will be informing students from time to time about these assessments, giving the requisite guidelines for the same.
- Student's Portfolio assessment for each subject will consist of notebook assessment, class performance, and subject exploration.

PASS CRITERIA

1. In the scholastic area, a student needs to secure overall 33% marks (both Pen Paper Test & Internal Assessment taken together) (i.e D Grade) to be able to pass that subject. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% marks should be secured in Annual Examination.
2. A student scoring less than 33% (i.e E grade) in more than 2 subjects will be detained. Retest is permitted in maximum of 2 subjects only.
3. If any student fails in any one of the three elective subjects (i.e. Science, Mathematics and Social Science) and passes in the skill subject (offered as 6 additional subject) then that subject will be replaced by skill subject and the result will be computed accordingly.
4. If a student studies three compulsory subjects i.e., Science, Mathematics and Social Science (Subject 3, 4, 5) and also chooses to study a Skill subject (Subject 6) then the aggregate of best five including two languages (Subject 1 & 2) and the best three (from subject 3, 4, 5 & 6, including Skill subject) can be considered for Calculation of percentage.
5. In order to be declared Pass in Skill subjects involving practical, a student has to secure 33% marks in practical and theory separately.
6. It is mandatory for a student to pass in the additional subject in class IX as per passing criteria. For students who are unable to meet the passing criteria, a retest will be scheduled. Failure to fulfill the passing criteria after retest will lead to surrender of the additional subject in Class X.

Re-Examination/ Compartment (Class-IX)

A student scoring less than 33% (i.e E grade) in 2 subjects will be permitted for Retest in those subjects. The retest will be conducted within a month of Annual Examination. The Compartment Examination will be conducted on the same pattern of Annual Examination i.e. three hours duration and 80 marks.

CLASS- XI

ATTENDANCE

- Every student must have a minimum of 75% attendance, failing which he/she will not be allowed to sit in the final examination/will not be promoted to the next higher class, as per the CBSE guidelines.
- Students must not miss any assessment unless on grounds of extreme emergency like a contagious disease, fracture etc. for which a medical certificate from a certified government hospital practitioner and supporting medical reports must be submitted within one week of the absence.

SCHEME OF ASSESSMENT

- The Unit Tests will be conducted for 25 Marks each.
- Half Yearly and Annual exams will be conducted as per CBSE Assessment Scheme.

PASS CRITERIA FOR CLASS XI

- In order to be declared as having passed the Class XI Examination, the student must have obtained
 - A. A minimum of 33% marks in Theory Cumulative total and 33% in Practical INDIVIDUALLY for all the subjects
 - B. A school to have 3 rounds of Unit Tests. Best two of the three unit tests will be considered for the cumulative assessment.

Wherein Theory Cumulative total is computed as follows:

- 20% of UT (Best two of three)
- 20% of HALF YEARLY
- 60% of ANNUAL EXAMINATION

The numerical sum of the above weighted scores will be converted on a base of 80/70/60/40/30 as per the CBSE norms for that specific subject theory component.

Minimum subject wise score of 33% in Annual Examination

Both these criteria (A and B) must be fulfilled for a child to be declared passed and promoted.

ELIGIBILITY FOR RETEST IN CLASS 11 / DETENTION:

- A) A candidate obtaining less than 33% in one subject only will qualify for a retest in the specific subject.
- B) A candidate securing less than 33% in the retest shall be detained. In case of detention, no change of subject is permitted.
- C) A candidate obtaining less than 33% in two or more subjects will be detained. In case of detention, no change of subject is permitted.

MISSED/RETEST EXAMS

- A) If a student has missed any exam (except for points mentioned in B & C underneath), no average shall be given i.e. the student will be marked zero and there will be no retest.
- B) If a student is On Duty or has missed the Annual exam due to genuine medical reasons, retest shall be conducted only once and shall be held as per the declared schedule.
- C) If a student is On Duty, new admission or has missed the Half Yearly exam due to genuine medical reasons, proportionate marks may be awarded.

USE OF UNFAIR MEANS

If during the course of the examination, a student is found indulging in any kind of unfair practice, the exam will stand cancelled and the child will be awarded zero marks (applicable to Unit Test Exams and Half Yearly Exams). In the Annual Examination, he/she will have to appear for a retest in the subject at the end of the year.
